

BACK FROM THE BRINK: THE CALIFORNIA CONDOR






The bird's-eye view

- The California condor is the largest vulture in North America and belongs to the New World vultures.
- It used to be distributed across the whole of the North American continent but is now restricted to a small area around the west coast of the US.

Vulture species are divided into two groups: Old World vultures and New World vultures!

Old World vultures are found in Europe, Africa, and Asia while New World vultures are found in America (both North and South).

1987

Only 27 California condors were left in the wild! They were all captured and brought into zoos to help secure their future. San Diego Zoo played a big role in breeding the condors and getting them ready for their release in the wild.



The release in the wild of the zoobred condors starts. Without the work of zoos there would be no California condors left in the world! There are now around 340 individuals in the wild and zoos are still releasing individuals every year, helping the population grow.




