Fact File:

- The Philippine crocodile is a top predator
- There are around 100 adults left in the wild
- They are **relatively small** for a crocodile, especially compared to the saltwater crocs that are also found in the Philippines!
- They live in **creeks**, **rivers** and ponds



<u>Lifestyle:</u>

 They make two kinds of nests - in holes and in mounds - only one other type of crocodile does this!

• They eat fish, birds, and reptiles **but they** most like snails!

Main Threats:

- Habitat loss due to increased human population in these areas
- Hunting of crocodiles




DID YOU KNOW? Snails make up 70% of these crocs' diets!


Golden apple snails were introduced to the Philippines but started damaging crops. Philippine crocodiles help farmers by eating these snails.






